IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING™

The President's Lead by Bill Signorelli, CPP

Security America has always strived to assist public law enforcement, and contributing to the safety of the American public. Over the years, we have encouraged our security officers to contact and provide suspicious information to the various terrorism-fusion centers that are operated by State agencies.

Recently, we have taken a further step by joining as a partner with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's See Something, Say Something initiative. The following narrative is paraphrased about the program from the **DHS web site**:

"If You See Something, Say Something™" is a national campaign that raises public awareness of the indicators of terrorism and terrorism-related crime, as well as the importance of reporting suspicious activity to state and local law enforcement. Informed, alert communities play a critical role in keeping our nation safe. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is committed to strengthening hometown security by creating partnerships. Across the nation, we're all part of communities. In cities, on farms, and in the suburbs, we share everyday moments... But your every day is different than your neighbor's... So if you see something you know shouldn't be there—or someone's behavior that doesn't seem quite right—say something.

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate terrorism or terrorism-related crime. This includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Unusual items or situations:** *Vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended,*
- 2. Eliciting information:** *A person questions individuals at a level beyond curiosity,*
- 3. Observation/surveillance:** *Someone pays unusual attention to facilities or buildings beyond casual or professional interest.*

Some of these activities could be innocent—it's up to law enforcement to determine whether the behavior warrants investigation. To report suspicious activity, contact your local law enforcement agency. Describe specifically what you observed, including:

***Who** or **what** you saw; **when** you saw it; **where** it occurred; and **why** it's suspicious. If there is an emergency **dial 9-1-1**.*

The "If You See Something, Say Something™" campaign respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity.
